# CANNABIS CLINICAL OUTCOMES RESEARCH CONFERENCE (CCORC) 2021

Accepting abstract submissions until February 5th, 2021



The Consortium for Medical Marijuana Clinical Outcomes Research is now accepting <u>abstract submissions</u> for poster and oral presentations at the Cannabis Clinical Outcomes Research Conference (CCORC) on April 8 & 9, 2021.

Abstracts can report:

Cannabis research findings that enhance our understanding of medical marijuana clinical outcomes stemming from basic, translational, clinical, or populations health studies; educational and quality improvement projects; policy evaluation involving the use of medical marijuana; and investigations of use behaviors or trends. All submissions will be peer-reviewed and must be submitted electronically by 11:59pm EST February 5, 2021.

Decisions will be communicated via email to the presenting author by March 1st, 2021. Abstracts will be published by the Consortium in the CCORC program and website if accepted, and top ranking abstracts will be published in the journal Medical Cannabis & Cannabinoids.

# The Consortium Board approves research priorities for the 2021 grants program

On December 4th, 2020, the Consortium Board convened to discuss and finalize the research priorities for the 2021 research grants program.

Based on the Consortium's research agenda defined by statute, inputs from a national panel of experts, results from a statewide provider survey, and NIH's programmatic areas of interest for cannabis research, the Board approved the following research priorities for 2021:

- 1. Clinical outcomes (effectiveness and safety) of medical marijuana use
- 3. Interactions of medical marijuana with other drugs/medications
- 5. Research on the human endocannabinoid system
