

Connect and Advance Medical Marijuana Analysis (CARMMA) Database

The Consortium launched the **Connect and Advance Research for Medical Marijuana Analysis (CARMMA) Database** to connect researchers, physicians, and industry collaborators with the goal to increase and accelerate medical marijuana research.

Rules & Guidelines

Eligibility and Joining CARMMA

- In joining CARMMA, you consent to have all information (including contact information) entered during registration be placed in a public-facing table accessed via the Consortium's website.
- Researchers, healthcare providers, agency and/or regulatory personnel, and industry representatives are eligible to submit information for review and potential inclusion within the CARMMA Database.
- Requests to join CARMMA are submitted via the form located at mmjoutcomes.org/carmma.

For Researchers

- Researchers must be affiliated with a university or college as a faculty member, research staff, student, or other trainee (e.g., post-doc, medical resident).
- Researchers agree to consider invitations for collaboration on medical marijuana research in Florida.
- Researchers will be asked to provide an online research profile, if applicable (i.e., Google Scholar or faculty profile url).

For Healthcare Providers

- Healthcare Providers should indicate the following in the expertise section when submitting their information to the CARMMA Database:
 - Interest in collaborating as a medical expert, a recruitment site, a survey taker, etc.
 - Expertise in a specific health condition, if applicable
 - Certification status for medical marijuana authorizations

For Industry Collaborators

- Industry collaborators are defined as any private or public organizations who are interested in collaborating with medical marijuana research in Florida.

- Collaborations are defined as any specific expertise or products that could be used in medical marijuana research, including product discounts and offerings, recruitment opportunities, assistance with clinical trials, etc.
- Industry collaborators will be allowed to use their standard logo as the image for their CARMMA entry. Any promotional/advertisement materials will not be allowed for the image.

Using CARMMA

- The Consortium does not endorse businesses, products, or other outputs produced resulting from use of the CARMMA Database.
- CARMMA members may not use the database for advertising purposes or to distribute marketing materials.
- The Consortium reserves the right to review submissions and to remove any researcher, provider, dispensary, or industry collaborator at any time for any reason, including the violation of the procedures and guidelines listed in this document.
- The Consortium will request updated information from each collaborator on a semi-annual basis and reserves the right to remove any collaborator that does not respond to this request.
